- Should MCGA be involved in legislative efforts? If so, how?
 - Updates at MCGA membership meetings? MCGA listserv?
 - MDHHS cannot sent updates through listserv; others can post to listserv
 - Join other groups with lobbying efforts to receive updates (e.g. MAGC, ACS, MiOCA, etc)?
 - MCGA co-chairs and policy workgroup to review each legislative effort and decide level of involvement?
 - Other ideas?

- Genetic Counseling Licensure Bills
 - At request of MAGC, MCGA Co-Chairs provided letters of support
- Resolution to support raising age limit for tobacco products to 21 years of age

CDC-MDHHS Cancer Genomics Cooperative Agreement

Activity P5: In years 1-5, MDHHS Cancer Genomics will develop and assess multiple approaches to implement cascade screening best practices utilizing health system policies, electronic reporting, social media, health insurance policy, laboratory reporting and/or position statements.

Activity E3: In years 1-5, MDHHS will develop and disseminate existing and new patient and provider educational resources on cascade screening.

MDHHS Accomplishments to Date:

- Kintalk.org disseminated through multiple venues
 - MI website hits increasing
- Examples of cascade screening clinic letters, CDC and FORCE resources posted on www.Michigan.gov/hereditarycancer
- Reviewed annual trends in single site numbers with multiple clinics
- Barriers and facilitators to cascade screening identified by site visits to clinics and interviews by Ms. Rachel MacCauley's WSU graduate student project
- >20 individuals received assistance from MDHHS regarding cascade screening issues (contacted directly or through general genetics e-mail or toll free line)
- MCC Update and MAHP Insight articles written
- Met with Dr. Patrick Lynch regarding cascade screening LS registry approach
- Hosted three webinars on cascade screening
 - Two on kintalk.org; Dr. Stoffel on Lynch syndrome study
